
Pink and Chum Salmon: A Comeback Story

- Diversifying Roe Markets






Historical Pink Salmon Harvests


Historical Chum Salmon Harvests

Product Diversification Increases Pink and Chum Value




Canned Salmon Prices Increase Due to Less


Value of Exported Frozen Pink and Chum

What Does this Mean for Alaskans?

Southeast Seine	\$75,900	\$32,800	\$129,500
PWS Seine	64,300	13,500	140,000
Kodiak Seine	50,400	8,600	44,000
Southeast Gillnet	70,800	21,100	80,100
PWS Gillnet	69,000	35,900	161,600
Kodiak Gillnet	92,600	39,500	74,700

Since the 2002/03, the ex-vessel value of pink and chum salmon fisheries has increased over 400 percent and these permits have increased in value by a total of \$185 million.
