### *Environmental variation and Pacific salmon management: the view from both sides of the border*

The Southern Panel and Coho Technical Committee are pleased to announce the launch of a virtual seminar series available to the entire PSC family. Arising from the May 11, 2021, workshop on environmental indicators and salmon management, the series will provide the latest information on environmental variation, its effects on salmon across their life cycle, and approaches to address this variability in salmon management from both western and indigenous perspectives. This monthly seminar series will feature noted speakers from the United States and Canada to discuss diverse aspects of environmental variation and their impacts to salmon and management. Following each presentation will be an extended Q & A session to allow in-depth discussion of the topic.

Heat waves and ocean blobs, what’s next?**” featuring Nick Bond (State Climatologist for Washington) and Faron Anslow (Climatologist at University of Victoria) on Monday, January 10 from 2:00 - 3:30pm (PST). The seminar will be hosted on Zoom and will also be live streamed in Regency C on the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor of the Hyatt Regency Vancouver.

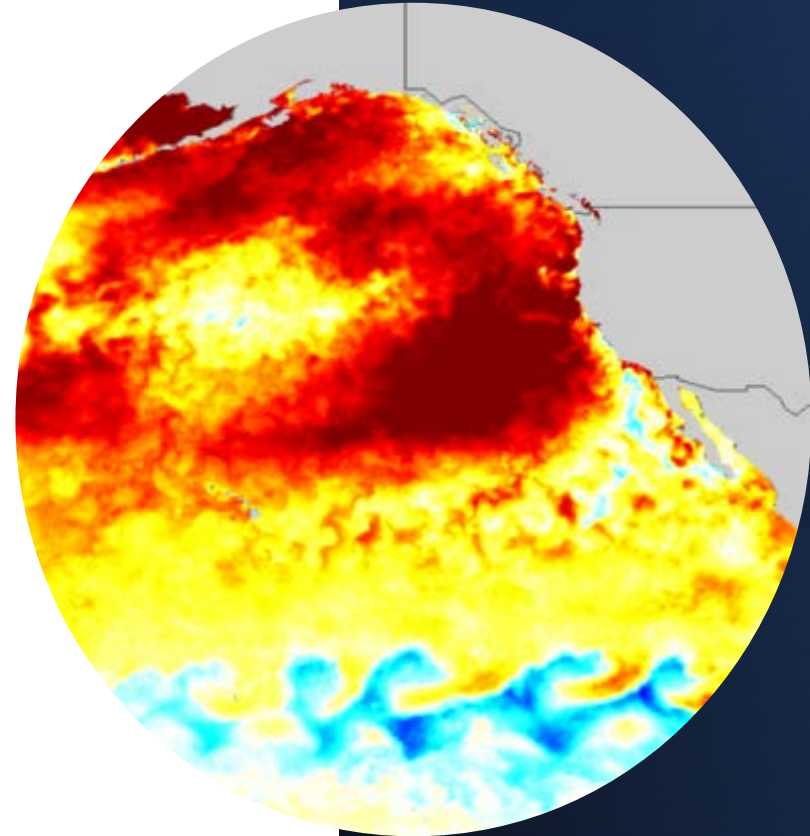
