The Fraser River Panel met Tuesday, September 5, to receive an update on the migration of Fraser River sockeye and pink salmon and review the status of migration conditions in the Fraser River watershed. It is currently estimated that 1,471,900 sockeye and 3,752,800 pink salmon have passed the Mission hydroacoustics site.

The discharge of the Fraser River at Hope on September 4 was 1,658 cms, which is approximately 31% below the historical average for this date. The temperature of the Fraser River at Qualark on September 4 was 18.3°C, which is 1.6°C above the historical average for this date. Fraser River discharge levels and water temperatures will be monitored closely to determine if specific management actions are required during the in-river migratory period to help achieve sockeye escapement goals.
