On Friday, September 15, the Fraser River Panel received an update on the migration of Fraser River sockeye and pink salmon to review the status of migration conditions in the Fraser River watershed. It is currently estimated that 1,578,500 sockeye and 7,510,800 pink salmon have passed the Mission hydroacoustics site.

The discharge of the Fraser River at Hope on September 14 was 1,291 cms, which is approximately 40% below the historical average for this date. The temperature of the Fraser River at Qualark on September 14 was 17.1°C, which is 1.6°C above the historical average for this date. Fraser River discharge levels and water temperatures will be monitored closely to determine if specific management actions are required during the in-river migratory period to help achieve sockeye escapement goals.
